How the Parish Nurse can help...

HE/SHE CAN:

- 1. PRAY WITH YOU.
- 2. HELP YOU UNDERSTAND YOUR POST-SURGERY INSTRUCTIONS, IF YOU WERE STILL GROGGY FROM ANESTHETIC WHEN DISCHARGED FROM OUT-PATIENT SURGERY.
- 3. HELP YOU GET SET UP WITH VARIOUS SOCIAL AGENCIES, IF YOU NEED SOME SPECIAL SERVICE, LIKE HOUSEKEEPING AIDES, HOME NURSING CARE OR SUPPORT GROUPS.
- 4. HELP YOU UNDERSTAND MEDICAL PROCEDURES WHEN YOU OR A LOVED ONE ARE IN CRITICAL HEALTH CARE.
- 5. HELP YOU MAKE A LIST OF QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR DOCTOR.
- 6. VISIT YOU IN YOUR HOME IF YOU ARE NOT ABLE TO GET OUT AND PROVIDE ROUTINE CHECKS SUCH AS TAKING BLOOD PRESSURE.
- 7. ORGANIZE HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAMS AND SCREENINGS SO YOU CAN UNDERSTAND YOUR PHYSICAL NEEDS AND CHANGES AND BECOME MORE RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR OWN AND YOUR FAMILY'S HEALTH.
- 8. MAINTAIN YOUR PRIVACY. ONLY CATEGORIES AND NUMBERS WILL BE REPORTED AS PARISH HEALTH INFORMATION TO CHURCH COMMITTEES.
- 9. LISTEN TO YOU. YOUR PARISH NURSE HAS THE TIME AND INTEREST TO HELP YOU MAINTAIN THE BEST HEALTH POSSIBLE.

HE/SHE CANNOT:

- 1. GIVE HANDS ON CARE OTHER THAN BLOOD PRESSURE.
- 2. GIVE DAILY BATHS. HOWEVER, YOUR PARISH NURSE CAN INSTRUCT OTHERS IN THIS PROCEDURE.
- 3. PRESCRIBE OR SUPPLY MEDICATIONS.
- 4. GIVE INJECTIONS. HOWEVER, IF THE NEED IS LARGE ENOUGH, YOUR PARISH NURSE CAN ARRANGE FOR OTHER HEALTH PROFESSIONALS TO PROVIDE IMMUNIZATIONS (SUCH AS FLU SHOTS) FOR RECOMMENDED GROUPS.
- 5. MAKE HEALTH PROBLEMS GO AWAY, BUT WILL TRY TO HELP YOU UNDERSTAND WHAT IS HAPPENING.
